The memory of the GDR as a country of one's own origin and part of today's Federal Republic is the focus of contemporary history. It becomes clear what influence dealing with this "disappeared" country has on socio-political and cultural processes. The holdings of the Beeskow Art Archive have been re-screened for the exhibition and expanded beyond their historically conditioned limits with contemporary works of art. Artistic searches for traces make it possible to remember and to look far back, into the present and into the future.
